

Dear Mr. Owens:

FCA US LLC (f/k/a Chrysler Group LLC) ("FCA US") is a Delaware limited liability company with its principal place of business at 1000 Chrysler Drive, Auburn Hills, MI 48326.

Pursuant to 49 CFR Part 556, FCA US is petitioning for an exemption from the notification and remedy requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act because the noncompliance described below is inconsequential to motor vehicle safety.

This petition relates to FCA US' safety noncompliance vehicle recall V92 (NHTSA recall 19V-624) which involves vehicle placard incorrect seating capacity and calculated combined occupant and cargo weight values that do not meet the requirements of S4.3 of FMVSS 110. The Noncompliance Information Report was submitted to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration ("NHTSA") after FCA US determined that approximately 350 Chrysler Pacifica Limited vehicles built between October 4, 2018 and July 3, 2019, may have a vehicle placard label with incorrect seating capacity and combined occupant and cargo weight values. Three copies of the 49 CFR Part 573 Defect Information Report for V92 (NHTSA recall 19V-624) filing are attached as Enclosure A.

Description of the Noncompliance

FCA US has determined that some 2019 MY Chrysler Pacifica Limited vehicles built with a specific sunroof package have a vehicle placard label with incorrect seating capacity and calculated combined occupant and cargo weight values, resulting in a 49 CFR 571.110 (FMVSS 110) noncompliance.

FMVSS 110, S4.3, requires a permanently affixed vehicle placard to display "(a) vehicle capacity weight expressed as 'the combined weight of occupants and cargo should never exceed XXX kilograms or XXX pounds; and (b) designated seated capacity (expressed in terms of total number of occupants and number of occupants for each front and rear seat location)." The vehicle placard indicates the total designated seating capacity as seven occupants rather than eight occupants, the rear designated seating capacity as five occupants rather than six occupants, and shows a combined occupant and cargo weight of 1,150 lbs. rather than 1,240 lbs.



<u>Justification for Petition for a Determination of Inconsequentiality</u>

For the reasons discussed below, FCA US believes that this technical noncompliance is inconsequential to motor vehicle safety:

- While the number of occupants and calculated weight are incorrect on the vehicle placard label, the
 calculated weight for seven occupants (1,150 lbs.) is below the calculated weight for eight occupants (1,240
 lbs.), and therefore, there is no risk of vehicle overloading.
- All information required for maintaining and/or replacing the front and rear tires is correct on the vehicle
 placard of the affected vehicles. In fact, the recommended cold tire inflation pressures for both the seven
 occupant and the eight occupant vehicles are the same. Therefore, there is no risk of under-inflation.
- All other applicable requirements of FMVSS No. 110 have been met.
- The vehicle certification label is correct. Vehicles with seven occupants and eight occupants share the same Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (6055 lbs.), and front and rear Gross Axle Weight Rating (2950 lbs. and 3200 lbs., respectively).
- The number of seats and the number of safety belts installed in the vehicle will clearly indicate to a vehicle
 owner the actual seating capacity, the rear seating of the affected vehicles contains six seat belt assemblies,
 and provides adequate space for six people to occupy the rear seats. Further, the vehicle in fact does
 accommodate six occupants, not five as labeled.
- FCA US is not aware of any crashes, injuries, or customer complaints associated with this condition.
- The NHTSA has previously granted inconsequential treatment for FMVSS 110 noncompliance for incorrect vehicle placard seated capacity values. Examples of the Agency granting a similar inconsequentiality petition for vehicle placard incorrect seated capacity are:
 - o General Motors, LLC, NHTSA-2013-0006 N2, November 21, 2014
 - BMW of North America, LLC, a Subsidiary of BMW AG, NHTSA-2012-0075 N2, July 22, 2013
 - o Ford Motor Company, NHTSA-2008-0183 N2, December 31, 2009

It is FCA US' belief that the information described above satisfies the intent of 49 CFR Part 556 and operators can safely utilize their vehicles for the intended purposes. FCA US believes that, pursuant to 49 CFR Part 556, 49 USC §30118(d) and §30120(h), the FMVSS 110 S4.3, this vehicle placard label seating capacity and calculated combined occupant and cargo weight noncompliance is inconsequential to motor vehicle safety and FCA US should be exempted from the notification and remedy requirements of 49 USC Chapter 301, "Motor Vehicle Safety" for the reasons supporting exemption cited above.

Vehicle placard values in unsold vehicles will be updated to reflect the correct seating capacity and combined weight values prior to first retail sale.

In consideration of the foregoing demonstration that subject noncompliant condition is inconsequential as it relates to motor vehicle safety, FCA US petitions to be exempt from the notification and remedy provisions of the Motor Vehicle Safety Act as provided in 49 CFR Part 556.

The suspect period began on October 4, 2018, when the tire placard label with incorrect seating capacity and calculated combined occupant and cargo weight was introduced into vehicle production, to July 3, 2019, when the tire placard label was corrected. Vehicle production records were used to identify the suspect period.

Similar vehicles not included in the recall were not the Limited trim level with the specific sunroof package or were built before or after the suspect period.
