SIDE UNDERRIDE GUARD PILOT PROGRAM. 4 (a) Definitions.—In this section: (1) COVERED VEHICLE.—The term "covered ve-5

15	(5) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means

17	(b) PILOT PROGRAM.—Not later than 1 year after
18	the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall carry
19	out a pilot program under section 31315(c) of title 49,
20	United States Code—
21	(1) to study the operational details, benefits,
22	and safety impacts of installing side underride
23	guards on covered vehicles, including—
24	(A) the effect of side underride guards on
25	the total fuel cost for a covered vehicle;

1	(B) the effect of side underride guards on
2	the frame of a covered vehicle, including—
3	(i) whether side underride guards put
4	any additional stress on the frame of a
5	covered vehicle as compared to covered ve-
6	hicles without side underride guards; and
7	(ii) whether there is any change in the
8	structure or structural integrity of a cov-
9	ered vehicle equipped with side underride
10	guards as compared to a covered vehicle
11	that is not equipped with side underride
12	guards;
13	(C) any effect of side underride guards on
14	the ability of a covered vehicle—
15	(i) to clear rail grade crossings; and
16	(ii) to navigate loading docks;
17	(D) whether side underride guards limit
18	access to, or displace equipment on, the under-
19	carriage of a covered vehicle; and
20	(E) whether side underride guards inhibit
21	inspection of a covered vehicle;
22	(2) to collect statistically significant data that
23	is sufficient to inform the Secretary in—
24	(A) making the assessment required under
25	paragraph (3); and

1	(B) developing performance standards
2	under paragraph (4);
3	(3) to assess the feasibility, benefits, and costs
4	associated with installing side underride guards on
5	newly manufactured covered vehicles; and
6	(4) to develop performance standards for side
7	underride guards for covered vehicles.
8	(c) Requirements.—
9	(1) Number of covered vehicles.—
10	(A) TOTAL NUMBER OF COVERED VEHI-
11	CLES IN THE PILOT PROGRAM.—The Secretary
12	shall select 20 of each kind of covered vehicle
13	described in subparagraphs (A) through (C) of
14	subsection $(a)(1)$ for participation in the pilot
15	program.
16	(B) COVERED VEHICLES EQUIPPED WITH
17	SIDE UNDERRIDE GUARDS.—Of the covered ve-
18	hicles selected for participation in the pilot pro-
19	gram under subparagraph (A), the Secretary
20	shall equip 10 of each kind with side underride
21	guards.
22	(2) Specifications of side underride
23	GUARDS.—The Secretary shall determine the speci-
24	fications of the side underride guards to be installed
25	on covered vehicles under the pilot program.

1	(3) Monitoring of covered vehicles.—
2	(A) In general.—For each covered vehi-
3	cle selected for participation in the pilot pro-
4	gram under paragraph (1)(A), the Secretary
5	shall—
6	(i) track—
7	(I) the number of trips taken by
8	the covered vehicle during the dura-
9	tion of the pilot program; and
10	(II) the number of miles traveled
11	by the covered vehicle during the du-
12	ration of the pilot program; and
13	(ii) monitor, in a manner determined
14	to be appropriate by the Secretary, the op-
15	erations of the covered vehicle.
16	(B) EVALUATION.—In evaluating the oper-
17	ational details, benefits, and safety impacts of
18	installing side underride guards on covered ve-
19	hicles under this section, the Secretary shall
20	compare the data obtained from the tracking
21	and monitoring carried out under subparagraph
22	(A) for the covered vehicles equipped with side
23	underride guards under paragraph (1)(B) to
24	the data obtained from that tracking and moni-

1	toring for the other covered vehicles selected for
2	participation in the pilot program.
3	(4) Driver surveys.—On completion of the
4	pilot program, the Secretary shall provide to the
5	driver of each covered vehicle equipped with side
6	underride guards under paragraph (1)(B) a survey
7	regarding any effects of the side underride guards.
8	(5) Inspections.—
9	(A) In general.—During the pilot pro-
10	gram, the Secretary shall require periodic in-
11	spections of—
12	(i) each covered vehicle selected for
13	participation in the pilot program under
14	paragraph $(1)(A)$; and
15	(ii) the side underride guards installed
16	on covered vehicles under paragraph
17	(1)(B).
18	(B) Requirement.—An inspection carried
19	out under subparagraph (A) shall not be car-
20	ried out by the driver of the covered vehicle or
21	another driver.
22	(6) Crash reports.—The Secretary shall re-
23	quire the driver of each covered vehicle equipped
24	with a side underride guard under paragraph (1)(B)
25	to submit to the Secretary a report on any crash in-

1	volving the covered vehicle in which a passenger
2	motor vehicle or vulnerable road user interacted with
3	the side underride guard.
4	(d) Duration of Pilot Program.—The duration
5	of the pilot program shall be 180 days.
6	(e) CONTRACT LIMITATION.—If the Secretary enters
7	into a contract with a third party to carry out the pilot
8	program, the Secretary shall ensure that the third party
9	does not have any financial or contractual ties to or rela-
10	tionships with—
11	(1) a motor carrier;
12	(2) the motor carrier industry; or
13	(3) an entity producing or supplying underride
14	guards.
15	(f) Publication of Assessment.—Not later than
16	90 days after completion of the pilot program, the Sec-
17	retary shall—
18	(1) publish in the Federal Register a notice
19	containing the assessment required under subsection
20	(b)(3); and
21	(2) provide an opportunity for public comment.
22	(g) Report on Pilot Program.—Not later than 1
23	year after the date on which the pilot program is com-
24	pleted, the Secretary shall submit to Congress and make
25	publicly available a report describing—

1	(1) the results of the pilot program;
2	(2) the assessment required under subsection
3	(b)(3); and
4	(3) a summary of any comments received by the
5	Secretary under subsection (f)(2).
