Automatic emergency braking ("AEB") technology conforming to Sections 1.A and 1.B of the Commitment was included on 98% of light duty vehicles and trucks 8,500 lbs. GVWR or less manufactured for sale in the United States from September 1, 2020 through August 31, 2021.¹

¹ Pursuant to the Commitment, the following may be excluded from this figure: (a) vehicles manufactured for use as police or other emergency services vehicles, (b) vehicles with re-design or end-of-life cycles occurring within 12 months of August 31, 2023, and (c) vehicles with manual transmissions (which will be equipped with AEB as standard equipment on substantially all such vehicles no later than 2024).
