Re: Docket ID No. NHTSA-2021-0053

For the attention of Michael S. Regan at the Environmental Protection Agency:

Sierra Club has collected 4,103 public comments asking The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration to set stringent fuel economy standards that drive down vehicle emissions, protect public health, and improve gas mileage.

This document includes 1,255 personalized public comments. We have highlighted a selection of 20 comments. The names of the individuals submitting comments are listed below. Each of the individuals signed onto the following text:

*We appreciate President Biden making cleaner cars a day-one priority and NHTSA moving quickly to propose a new regulation to replace the prior administration's weak standards.*

*The vast majority of our vehicles today are gas-powered, expensive to own and fuel. People spend excessive amounts of money at the gas pump, often a large part of a family's expenses.*
