Subject:Petition for Exemption for Inconsequential Noncompliance with FMVSS 213 Section5.5, "Labeling," Concerning the statement: "This child restraint system conforms to all
applicable Federal motor vehicle safety standards."

Dear Administrator Cliff:

Diono LLC ("Diono") submitted a Noncompliance Information Report, pursuant to 49 C.F.R. § 573.6, to NHTSA on June 22, 2022 relating to labels that were missing the following statement: "This child restraint system conforms to all applicable Federal motor vehicle safety standards." We attach a copy of the Report as Exhibit A.

Diono now submits this Petition for Exemption for Inconsequential Noncompliance pursuant to 49 C.F.R. § 556.4 for this issue. Diono does not believe this noncompliance creates a risk to motor vehicle safety requiring a recall. Diono also believes that it fulfilled the purpose of the regulations implicated.

Diono has determined that the labels in question did not fully comply with FMVSS 213 S5.5.2. Specifically, the statement: "This child restraint system conforms to all applicable Federal motor vehicle safety standards." was missing for 2,642 seats.

Diono provides the following information required under 49 C.F.R. § 556.4(b):

Diono LLC is a limited lability company organized under the laws of the state of Washington.

2. Describe the motor vehicle or item of replacement equipment, including the number involved and the period of production, and the defect or noncompliance concerning which an exemption is sought.

Diono has determined that labels on its child safety restraint systems do not fully comply with FMVSS 213 S.5.5 concerning labeling. The following statement required by FMVSS 213 S.5.5 is missing: "This child restraint system conforms to all applicable Federal motor vehicle safety standards." Diono has identified noncompliance by the following product outlined in the following chart:



3. Set forth all data, views, and arguments of the petitioner supporting his petition.

As set forth more fully in this Petition, Diono believes that the missing statement issue does not affect motor vehicle safety. The labels missing the statement were never the subject of any inquiry from any customer who purchased the affected seats.

An example of a fully-compliant label (which is being used going forward) is here:

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Furthermore, the required statement was included in the instruction manual for the products.

Accordingly, Diono believes that this is an inconsequential noncompliance.

4. Be accompanied by three copies of the report the manufacturer has submitted, or is submitting, to NHTSA in accordance with part 573 of this chapter, relating to its determination of the existence of safety related defect or noncompliance with an applicable safety standard that is the subject of the petition.

By electronic correspondence dated July 20, 2022, Diono's counsel was advised that NHTSA has waived this requirement. A single copy of the Part 573 report is attached as Exhibit A.

FURTHER INFORMATION IN SUPPORT OF THE PETITION

NHTSA has previously stated the following:

In the noncompliance context, in some instances, NHTSA has determined that a manufacturer met its burden of demonstrating that a noncompliance was inconsequential to safety. For example, labels intended to provide safety advice to an occupant that may have a misspelled word, or that may be printed in the wrong format or the wrong type size, have been deemed inconsequential where they

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should not cause any misunderstanding, especially where other sources of correct information are available.

Mazda North American Operations Ruling on Petition for Decision of Inconsequential Noncompliance, 86 Fed. Reg. 7170-01, 7171 & 7182 (Jan. 26, 2021) (denied on other grounds and noting "far too many shortcomings").

The instruction manual on page 7 clearly advises consumers as follows:

CERTIFICATIONS

This Child Restraint System conforms to all applicable Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards (FMVSS 213).

Thus, consumers have an adequate and alternative means of being informed of the compliance status of the subject seats, and Diono did still self-certify all affected seats before distributing them for sale in the United States. To use NHTSA's own words, "other sources of correct information are available" with the required information.

Furthermore, it is highly unlikely that consumers would conclude the seat does not meet FMVSS 213, given that no child restraint can be legally sold in the United States without such compliance. Diono also expects that consumers assume that products on the market meet mandatory safety standards, whatever those standards might be. Otherwise, the product could not legally be sold in the first place, particularly through credible major retailers.

Diono has received no reports from consumers who were confused about the compliance of the subject seats with Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards. Diono also maintains a customer service department that answers any questions customers have about product safety, including queries that relate to compliance with safety standards.

Accordingly, Diono requests that NHTSA grant Diono's Petition for Exemption, and agree that Diono is exempt from the Safety Act's notification and remedy requirements for this issue.
