Mazda writes to provide an update on progress following the establishment of the *Leading Automakers' Commitment to Implement Rear Seat Reminder Systems* (the "Commitment") in September 2019.¹

The following provides a listing of the nameplates manufactured for sale in the United States beginning on September 1, 2022, through August 31, 2023, that are included in Mazda's Commitment Fleet. This serves as Mazda's required Annual Report under the Commitment.

The overall proportion of vehicles manufactured for sale in the United States beginning on September 1, 2022, through August 31, 2023, that are included in Mazda's Commitment Fleet, was **8.8** percent, with **32,232** vehicles equipped with a standard rear seat reminder. Mazda remains committed to full implementation by the 2025 model year.
