While the total number of children in the U.S. has grown slightly since 2000, the share of the population that is under age 18 decreased from 25.7% in 2000 to 22.3% in 2029, according to the Census Bureau. This level of geriatric care will require and interdisciplinary approach to provide comprehensive education and care plans for vulnerable older adults at risk of morbidity, ED revisits, and potentially avoidable hospital admission.
